SLO City Gets a Bike Signal: Bicycle Coalition Campaign Makes a Difference



At the south end of the Bill Roalman Bicycle Boulevard is a new bike signal just installed at the intersection of Santa Barbara and Upham streets. The arrival of this new device is a great victory for our community. Two years ago the Bicycle Coalition led a campaign to improve the safety of this intersection by leading a letter writing campaign to the city council. Your voice was heard and we now have reason to celebrate. The signal will now provide a safer connection between the bike boulevard and the Railroad Safety Trail, making it better not only for bicyclists, but also pedestrians and motorists. SLO is now among only three cities in California to have its own bike signal, joining Davis and Palo Alto. Thanks to all of you who wrote to the city council. We'd also like to thank the city council and city staff for their part in making the signal possible.

How do I use the new signal?

When approaching the intersection, place your bicycle over the bike symbol on the sidewalk pavement. When the bike signal turns green, all motor traffic has a red light and you are allowed to cross the intersection.

Bill Roalman Bike Boulevard in SLO Now Open

The Bill Roalman Bike Blvd on Morro Street has been open since February, paving the way for easier bike travel between the Railroad Safety Trail and downtown SLO. This is historic as SLO now has the first bike blvd in California south of the Bay Area. We are now only the third city in California to have them, joining Palo Alto and Berkeley. What is a bike blvd, you ask? It's a neighborhood street where bicycles are given priority over cars. To make this all possible, the City has flipped a few stop signs for easier travel down the blvd, painted big bicycle symbols on the asphalt, and added new signs designating the bike blvd. So, don't be afraid to ride in the middle of the lane. It's there for you! In fact, ride it as often as you can, as it helps us urge the City to build a whole network of these around town.

A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

This year has been our busiest one yet. First of all, our efforts with the SLO city budget are making progress. Because of the many people who participated in our "Bike the Budget" campaign the new budget now includes funding to complete a portion of the Railroad Safety Trail from Foothill Blvd across Hwy 101. The budget also includes \$220,000 of general fund money to complete a segment of the Bob Jones Trail from Prado Road to Los Osos Valley Road. Last but not least, \$15,000 per year has been allocated for bicycle education.

This spring we saw progress in two great projects. One was the debut of the Bill Roalman Bicycle Boulevard. SLO is now only the third city in California to have a bike boulevard and the only city in the state to build one in at least 10 years. Some people like it so much they have been known to go out of their way on their daily commute just to ride it.

The other great project was the installation of a bike signal at the corner of Santa Barbara and Upham streets. The signal is a great example of the effectiveness of our work. In 2004 the Bicycle Coalition joined with other bicycle advocacy organizations throughout the state and pressured Sacramento to reauthorize the use of bike signals in California. The effort to remove the sunset clause was successful and led the way for us to work for getting a signal installed here in SLO. The Bicycle Coalition then led a letter writing campaign and presented the idea to the SLO City Council based on the model of a successful signal in Portland, Oregon. The City heard your concerns and now we have a much safer way for bicyclists to get across Santa Barbara Street.

Bike Coalition Advocates for Better Sweeping on County Roads

Over the last few months the Bicycle Coalition has been working with the county and the SLO Council of Governments on improving the sweeping of bike lanes and shoulders.

Currently, there is no schedule for sweeping county roads. It is entirely request based. Therefore, if you have a road under county jurisdiction that needs sweeping, you can post a request at:

Try to be as specific as possible about where the sweeping is needed.

You can also make a follow up call to David Flynn at the county at 781-4463.

Meanwhile, we've succeeded in getting a couple of roads swept. This includes Orcutt Road,

Ontario Road, Los Osos Valley Road, St. Mary Avenue, Pomeroy Road, El Camino Real, and Main Street (Cambria) among others.

In the long term, the Bicycle Coalition is working to get bike lane and shoulder sweeping done on a more scheduled basis, especially on the more heavily traveled roads like Hwy 1, Hwy 227, Los Osos Valley Road, and Orcutt. This will take getting resources allocated into the county budget or finding grant funding.

Bike Valet Program Puts SLO Town in the Fast Lane

San Luis Obispo is at the cutting edge of a healthy lifestyle trend that is sweeping California: free bike parking at community events. Cities from Santa Monica to San Francisco are promoting cleaner air and better fitness by providing convenient, secure parking that encourages residents to choose bikes over cars. As a recent Los Angeles Times article said, "In California bicycle circles, this kind of service is the coming thing."

The SLO Bike Valet premiered in February 2006 at the Amgen Tour of California, which finished in downtown San Luis Obispo. That day, the all-volunteer valet crew from the SLO County Bicycle Coalition and Team SLO Nexus parked over 200 bicycles. Since then, the program has offered free bicycle parking every week on Morro Street at downtown SLO Farmers' Market. Generous donations from businesses and individuals, grants from the City of San Luis Obispo and New Belgium Brewery, and the tremendous efforts of volunteers have allowed the program to grow to meet the ever-increasing demand.

Here's how it works: About 30 minutes before an event, three volunteers roll trailers full of gear to the event site and erect a tent, a table with free maps and brochures, and many rows of bicycle racks. Then they fence off the area to keep pedestrians out of the parking area, and to create an entryway under the tent where bicycles will then arrive and depart. Throughout the event, volunteers take bicycles from clients, and provide them with a claim ticket to ensure they receive the correct bike upon their return. The system is then reversed when they come back—the claim tickets are matched to the bicycles, and the happy cyclists are on their way. In addition to parking bikes, the volunteers often answer questions about bike routes, bicycle advocacy, bicycle education, where to find a bike shop, as well as many non-bike-related questions.

In the past year and a half, demand for the service has soared. About 35 bicycles per night was the average in the program's first several months. When the days got shorter and the nights colder, the numbers dipped slightly, but as soon as Daylight Savings Time returned, the bikes started rolling in like never before, from 50 bikes per night to 80 to an all-time high of 105 during Bike Fest in May. The program reached a milestone on June 14 when volunteers parked the valet's 2,000th bike.

With the valet firmly established at Farmers' Market, the Coalition has started expanding the SLO Bike Valet service to other community events. The most recent addition is Concerts in the Plaza, which takes place every Friday evening at the SLO Mission. As the demand for bike parking continues to grow, so does the need for volunteers. You don't need any special knowledge about bikes to help make the program a success; if you like bikes, you're

qualified. Volunteering for a two-hour shift is a great way to help make your community a better place. Plus, it's also a whole lot of fun.

DC Summit: Coalition Heads to Washington



This spring a delegation from the San Luis Obispo County Bicycle Coalition traveled to Washington DC and participated in the National Bike Summit.

About 430 delegates participated in the Summit, consisting of individuals representing bicycle and pedestrian advocacy organizations, government, health organizations, and the bicycle industry.

During the Summit, San Luis Obispo County Bicycle Coalition board member Greg McPheeters and executive director Adam Fukushima met personally with Representative Lois Capps of the 23rd Congressional District representing much of San Luis Obispo County.

McPheeters and Fukushima spoke to Capps about the need to complete our local bike trails like the Railroad Safety Trail as well as to urge her support for several new pieces of legislation. Highlights included the Bicycle Commuter Act (to provide a tax incentive for bicycle commuting) and Complete Streets policies, which lead to roads which are safe, convenient, and comfortable for all—pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists, transit users, and people with disabilities.

Lastly, the delegation thanked Capps for her support in the past for livable communities, including federal funding she secured for the Bob Jones City-to-Sea Bikeway.

Executive director Adam Fukushima was pleased to attend the summit. "High obesity levels as well as climate change and dependence on oil are big issues in Washington right now. We are excited to promote a form of transportation that helps provide a solution to all three. With over 60% of trips in the country consisting of 2 miles in length or less, bicycling provides an easy solution to our transportation problems. Ms. Capps understands these needs, and we are glad she is so receptive" says Fukushima.

The Summit also featured talks by representatives Earl Blumenauer (D-OR) and Jim Oberstar (D-MN), who are sponsoring the Bicycle Commuter Act. During the address Oberstar noted, "We're going to convert America from the hydrocarbon economy to the carbohydrate economy."
